Mission Statement

Service

As a service-oriented school, ACA encourages personal responsibility, a giving heart, and godly character in students who will be equipped to serve and lead in their communities. Our high school students annually participate in full class experiences on Bullington Service Days. The days are spent in city wide projects from partnering with local schools to cleaning parks to working in local shelters. In 2018 we launched “We Serve”, a community service program that provides opportunities for our students to serve our community monthly. These experiences include volunteering in the Salvation Army 9/11 Lunch for First Responders, cleaning facilities for Hope Inspired Ministries, and participation in the Tim Tebow “Night to Shine” annual event for those with special needs. ACA also partners on an annual basis with LifeSouth Blood Centers to host several all school blood drives.
